



## **ABSTRACT SUBMISSION INSTRUCTIONS FOR THE AUTHORS**

The abstract must be one-page maximum.

### ***Title***

Times New Roman, 12 pt, bold, centred, arranged on 1-2 lines.

### ***Authors***

Times New Roman, 11 pt, normal, centred, family name and first name initial (e.g.: Rossi, G.). In the case of multiple authors, they must be separated by a comma and identified by a number to identify the institute they belong to.

### ***Institute***

The list of institutes (Institute name, Department, City, Country) must be reported after the author list and a letter or number related to one or more of the authors must identify each institute. Times New Roman, 10 pt, regular, centred; only the email address of the reference author (corresponding author) can be reported after the abstract text.

### ***Keyword***

Times New Roman, 10 pt, regular, aligned left; up to a maximum of five.

### ***Text***

Times New Roman, 11 pt, normal, justified, paragraph indentation 0.5 cm, left and right margins 2 cm, top and bottom margins 2.5 cm.

The text, in English, must have a maximum length of 3000 characters, spaces included, including any bibliographic references. Summaries must consist of text only, without figures or tables. Footnotes cannot be inserted within the text. Bibliographic citations must be inserted in the text between round brackets: author's surname, comma, and year of edition. Multiple works cited in series must be entered in chronological order and separated by semicolons (e.g., Ramsay, 1987;

Ramsay & Huber; 1990; Ramsay et al., 2000). Mathematical formulas can also be entered as image files (.jpg format).

### **References**

The list of cited literature must be in alphabetical order and must include all, and only, the bibliographic references mentioned in the text. References may be made to works accepted and in press in journals, of which the name and volume are mentioned, and to doctoral and degree theses. Citations of works being prepared or being approved for printing are not permitted.

The various bibliographic references must follow the following formats (Times New Roman, 10 pt, normal, justified, first line protruding by 0.5 cm):

#### Magazine article
